² Students must take BIO 109, CHE 109 or PHY 109 to satisfy this requirement to transfer to LIU under this agreement. Please note, these courses have a co-requisite of the BIO 108, CHE 108 or PHY 108 courses (respectively). These co-requisite courses can be used to satisfy the Liberal Arts or General Electives.

³ Students must take SPE 100 or SPE 102 in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement.

⁴ Students must take PSY 100 in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement.

⁵ Students must take a modern foreign language (MFL) course in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement. In addition, students who complete 6 credits in MFL will not have to satisfy this requirement at LIU.

⁶ Students must take PSY 240 in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement.

⁷ Students must take PSY 260 in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement.

⁸ Students must take PSY 220 in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement.

⁹ Students must take PSY 250 in order to transfer to LIU under this agreement.

¹⁰ Students who complete 6 MFL credits at BMCC will have already satisfied this requirement.

¹¹ To graduate with a Bachelor of Science degree, students must complete a minimum of 120 credits with a grade point average of at least 2.00 in all their academic work and at least a 2.30 in their major fields, and have met all other graduation requirements. Of the 120 credits required for graduation, at least 48 must be in courses numbered over 100. The candidates for the Bachelor of Science degree must complete at least 60 credits in the liberal arts and sciences.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. *Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by each institution.

2. *Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*

Each semester LIU Brooklyn will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

Each semester, BMCC will provide LIU with a list of names and email addresses of students eligible to graduate from the BMCC program indicated in this agreement. LIU agrees to use this list *only once* to electronically contact eligible students.

3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, Websites, etc.:*

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and the LIU Brooklyn website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

BMCC will invite LIU to participate in one recruitment event per year at the BMCC campus, and will promote the event to eligible students. LIU will invite BMCC to participate in one recruitment event per year at the LIU campus specifically focused on BMCC students.

F. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

Scholarships

BMCC transfer students, upon completion of the BMCC degree requirements with a GPA of 3.0 or higher, will be considered for all Transfer Scholarships and Merit Awards available (i.e., Presidential Honors Scholarship, Honors Scholarship, Merit Scholarship, Recognition Scholarship, etc.). Scholarships are based on GPA earned at the time of admission. Merit-based scholarships are subject to change and exact amounts may vary from semester to semester. All scholarships are awarded on a funds-available basis.

Entering students from BMCC covered by this agreement shall enjoy all other financial aid benefits and considerations where applicable in conformance of current guidelines and regulations in effect at LIU Brooklyn.
