2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:
Each semester (Fall and Winter) Southern New Hampshire University will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled and; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:
This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and the Southern New Hampshire University website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
