B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

- Completion of the A.A. degree and a minimum GPA of 2.70.
- Recommended cumulative average of B or better in Psychology courses.
- Students entering the program are required to complete at least half (21 Credits) of the B.A. Psychology major course requirements with St. John's University.
- St. John's University retains the right to make the final decision on each student's application.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: **60**

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: **60**

Total credits required for the Bachelor of Arts in Psychology: **120**

C. TRANSFER CREDITS AWARDED

Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates who complete the Associate in Arts degree (A.A.) in Psychology will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Arts degree (B.A.) in Psychology at St. John's University.

NOTE 2: SHOULD STUDENTS CHOOSE TO TAKE PSY 220 BEHAVIORAL STATISTICS WITH BMCC, STUDENTS WILL BE SHY 1 CREDIT (ST. JOHN'S STATISTICS COURSE EQUIVALENT IS PSY 2030 WITH LAB FOR 4 CREDITS). IN THIS CASE, BMCC STUDENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO TAKE AN ADDITIONAL PSY ELECTIVE COURSE WITH ST. JOHN'S. IF STUDENT DOES NOT TAKE PSY 220 WITH BMCC REMAINING MAJOR COURSES WITH ST. JOHN'S ARE SUBJECT TO CHANGE.

Students interested in a Graduate Pathway option will have to apply and be accepted into the graduate program. Required to have a St. John's GPA and at least a 3.00 cumulative average.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement: When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by a representative from each institution.
2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success: Each semester St. John's University will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.: This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and St. John's University website. Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
