





College Readiness

CUNY START

CUNY Start is a low-cost, 16-week program for CUNY community college students who are required to enroll in one or more remedial course based on their incoming CUNY Assessment Test scores. In the CUNY Start Program, students enroll in Pre-College Math and/or Academic Reading/Writing, as needed. The ultimate goal of the program is to build college readiness for students entering CUNY, and to reduce or eliminate their developmental skills requirements.

PANTHER PARTNERS



LEARNING ACADEMY (BLA)


