Career Planning (CED 201) Designed to help students creatively plan their careers. The course covers self- assessment, career exploration and practical job search skills. Fundamentals of Public Speaking (SPE 100) – The aim of this course is to develop effective skills in speech communication. The student examines how to generate topics and organize ideas, masters elements of audience psychology and practices techniques of speech presentation in a public forum.	3	45	75 GPA in ELA coursework				
Introduction to Human Services and Social Work (HUM 101) – This course introduces students to the field of Human Services and the profession of Social Work. profession. Students are exposed to the methods of working with people as individuals, in groups and on a community level. This course meets the requirements as a liberal arts elective in social science.			
Introduction to Sociology (SOC 100) – This course studies the social world and how it has evolved over time, as well as how individuals are influenced and structured by social interactions in small groups and by larger social forces. General Psychology (PSY 100) – The course introduces students to the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. Students will learn about current perspectives, historical roots and scientific methods in psychology.
