- 480 on the Verbal section of the SAT or at least a 75 on the English Language Arts Regents or at least a 50 on the Verbal section of the PSAT.
- At least a 480 on the Mathematics section of the SAT or at least a 70 on the Common Core Algebra 1/Geometry Regents or at least 50 on the Math section of the PSAT.
 - Students who have not taken the Regents must have an overall high school GPA of 75
