#### **COVID-19 VACCINATION AND TESTING PROTOCOLS**

#### Covid-19 Protocols Update:

- Emergency vaccination mandate for students, faculty and staff ends May 23,
   2023
- Consistent with the federal governments plan to end the National Public Health Emergency in May
- Allows student to enroll for summer sessions regardless of their COVID-19 vaccination status
- BMCC Spring 2023 COVID-19 Plan will conclude on May 23, 2023
- COVID-19 testing program will end June 30, 2023

- BMCC's MEOC has won a \$1.5 million YouthBuild grant to provide construction services to 66 out of school youth over three years. This new construction training program will
  - Teach carpentry and plumbing skills
  - Provide on the job training for low-income housing rehabilitation
  - Provide certification to Harlem youth
  - Complement the MEOC's OSHA classes
  - BMCC was one of 68 winners nationwide, and one of 6 in New York to win this award.

**BMCC** is partnering with John Jay College to offer an academic preparation and college readiness summer bridge program for Black and Hispanic Men.

- Providing at no cost to nearly 500 students, a credit-bearing math course with
  - Peer assisted learning,
  - Community-building activities,
  - Workshops,
  - Field trips, and more.
- Students will be those entering into John Jay in the fall as well as Eagle Academy Foundation graduates not enrolled in a CUNY EOP.

**Second Chance Pell @ BMCC** – In partnership with BMCC's Project Impact and John Jay College Prison to College Pipeline Program

- Approved June 2020 to offer courses at Otisville Correctional Facility
- Initially students took courses at BMCC, received degree from John Jay
  - Post Covid-19: re-established external courses Spring '22
  - BMCC offered CRJ 101 and POL 100
  - Students enrolled at John Jay and took the BMCC courses on E-Permit
- New MOU Fall 2023: New students enroll @ BMCC, take courses @ John Jay or BMCC
- BMCC will now provide Associate Degree articulating to Bachelor's @ John Jay

- BMCC Annual Research Symposium (BARS), showcasing student research, Wednesday, May 10<sup>th</sup>. Registration and Program begin at 9 A. M. in N-453 and Poster Session and Awards begin at 1 P. M. in Richard Harris Terrace
- Second Annual Social Justice Week, Belonging Together, Learning
   Together, Growing Together, Sponsored by the Race, Equity, and Inclusion
   Steering Committee (REI), started April 24-28 in various locations; main
   event was held Tuesday, April 25<sup>th</sup> 12-3pm
- **BMCC President Munroe** hosted the Global Community College Leadership Network (GCCLN) on the BMCC campus 4/26-28/23 with representative Community College leaders from across the country and around the world.

- BMCC students Vanique Davis (Linguistics, Creative Writing) and Eduardo
  Lebron (Computer Science), have been awarded the Community College
  Global Affairs Fellowship, funded by the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation
  - Program runs from May 30 to August 16, 2023
  - Includes an in-person portion in Washington, DC
