<u>SciENcv</u>

NSF is moving to a new system called Science Experts Network Curriculum (SciENcv) for submitting biographical sketches and current and pending support for proposals. Beginning October 23, 2023, use of the SciENcv will be required and the NSF Fillable PDF will no longer be accepted.

What is SciENcv?

Science Experts Network Curriculum Vitae (SciENcv) is a new electronic system, offered by the National Institute of Health, that helps researchers assemble the professional information needed for participation in federally funded research. SciENcv gathers and compiles information on expertise, employment, education and professional accomplishments. Researchers can use SciENcv to create and maintain biosketches that are submitted with grant applications and annual reports. SciENcv allows researchers to describe and highlight their scientific contributions in their own words.

What SciENcv does:

- Eliminates the need to repeatedly enter bio sketch information
- Reduces the administrative burden associated with federal grant submission and reporting requirements
- Provides access to a researcher-claimed data repository with information on expertise, employment, education, and professional accomplishments
- Allow researchers to describe their scientific contributions in their own language

How to create a Biological Sketch Document in SciENcv?

- 1. Log into your SciENcv/NCBI account by using your NSF ID and password using this link. <u>https://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/sciencv/</u>
- Those selecting the "NSF Log in" option, as highlighted above, will be directed to sign in via Research.gov. Users will be automatically redirected back to the My NCBI homepage after their NSF login is successful.
- 3. You have the option to create a new NCBI account based on the sign-in route OR link to an existing NCBI account you already have.
- 4. Once you are logged into your SciENcv/NCBI account main page you have access to create or upload your Biographical Sketch

How to create a NSF Current and Pending Support document in SciENcv?

Go to the SciENCV portlet in <u>My NCBI</u> and click "Manage SciENCV" to access your SciENCV documents page. In the Science documents page click "Create New Document."
