

IN THIS ISSUE: OER COURSES

BMCC OFFICE OF INSTITUTIONAL EFFECTIVENESS AND ANALYTIC

The expense of textbooks is a large burden especially for community college students. In BMCC, an alternative approach was developed to respond to this issue. Open Educational Resource (OER) offers no-cost textbook material. This upshot aims to evaluate the impact OER has on student success outcomes. Pass and withdrawal rates of sections offering OER are compared to sections of the same course not offering OER. The impact these outcomes have on students who are underrepresented minorities (URM) was also examined.



In fall 2021, there was also a 7% higher pass rate among students who are URMs enrolled in OER sections compared to other sections of the same course.


Improvement in English and music pass rates by 10%




Based on the average pass rates in fall terms from 2018 to 2021, English (ENG) and music (MUS) courses showed the largest difference (10%) in pass rates between OER (68% and 72%) and other sections (58% and 62%).

Based on the average pass rates in fall terms from 2018 to 2021, media studies (MES) courses showed the largest difference (12%) in pass rates between OER (65%) and other sections (53%) among students who are URM.

Reduced withdrawal rates by 5% among URMs



Improvement in media studies pass rates by 12% among URMs



Among students who are URM, in the fall 2021 showed 5% lower withdrawal rates for OER (19%) compared to other sections (14%). Furthermore, among students who are URM in OER sections, withdrawal rates decreased by 1% from fall 2020 (15%) to fall 2021 (14%). However, among students who are URM in other sections, withdrawal rates increased by 3% from fall 2020 (16%) to fall 2021 (19%).
