

2023 - 2024 INSTITUTIONAL PRIORITIES

- CUNY LIFTING NEW YORK the University's new 2023 2030 Strategic Plan was unveiled this
 past July
- UNIVERSITY WIDE ANNUAL PLANNING the Performance Management Plan (PMP) requires college alignment with the University goals and initiatives
- BMCC MUST SET ANNUAL TARGETS the college must set annual performance targets and identify strategies to make progress on 18 of the University's Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) – Due October 6th
- METRICS THAT BMCC MUST FOCUS ON include enrollment, retention, transfer and graduation, student outcome disparities, career exploration and preparation, research, fundraising, professional development, and infrastructure
- STRATEGIES THAT BMCC IS PRIORITIZING include targeted recruitment, cohort experiences, supplemental instruction and tutoring, FYE, partner development, faculty and staff development, and expanding internship opportunities

ENROLLMENT

Enrollment Update

- 4% increase in applications (38,557 vs 37,091)
- 2% increase in accepted students (30,092 vs 29,472)
- 19.4% increase in students accepting admission offer (10,605 vs. 8,665)
- 16% increase in new freshmen (4,525 vs 3,905)
- 18% increase in new transfers (1,605 vs 1,361)
- 5.6% decrease in continuing students = (9106 in 2023 vs 9640 in 2022)

Renewed efforts to decrease high percentage of D's, F's, W's and INC's in Gateway courses

- Increased utilization of SI sessions
 - Fall 22: Student re-enrollment/graduation with SI 83%, Without SI 71%,
- Increased use of Connect2Success for Early Alert
 - Fall 22– Spring 23 retention rate for students who received even one flag was
 72.3% as compared to students with zero flags raised at 65.2%
- Instruction Committee working to encourage faculty to recommend tutoring and SI to improve grades/retention
- Developing pedagogy to address learning disruption in a post-COVID world.
- English and Math faculty exploring ways to improve pass rates in co-req courses.
