



**Transfer Articulation Agreement
between
Borough of Manhattan Community College
and
Trinity Washington University**

Effective April, 2023

This articulation agreement creates a transfer program between Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) and Trinity Washington University.

Admissions:

This Agreement applies only to college students who have successfully graduated from the BMCC with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Applied Science Degree in specific programs, prior to enrollment at the University. Such persons will be accepted to the University based on the following criteria:

Guaranteed Acceptance at Trinity Washington University will be granted in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein below to students who complete their associate degree with a minimum BMCC Grade Point Average of **2.00**.

Acceptance of Credits:

A maximum of **60-75** credits will be applied toward the completion of the articulated bachelor's degree programs. Trinity Washington University has a residency requirement defined as 45 of the last 60 credits must be completed at the institution. Trinity Washington University will accept transfer credits from BMCC with a minimum grade of "C", except for Nursing courses, which must have a minimum grade of "C+".

If given credit(s) do not count for requirements in the major, they will then count as open elective credit or general education toward the degree.

Transfer Scholarships:

Every student admitted into the Trinity Washington University College of Arts and Sciences (CAS) is considered for scholarships at the time of admission. More information on scholarships can be found at <https://discover.trinitydc.edu/enrollment/trinity-aid-cas/>.

Trinity Washington University School of Professional Studies offers degrees in Business Administration, Criminal Justice, Early Childhood Education, General Studies, Health Services, Human Relations, Journalism & Media Studies, and Psychology.

Students applying to the RN-BSN in the School of Nursing and Health professions may be eligible for the Conway Scholarship:

Students must meet minimum criteria prior to eligibility for Conway scholarships.

- Completed all general education courses
- Hold a 3.0 or better cumulative grade point average
- Hold a current, unencumbered nursing license
- Be enrolled as a full-time student
- Expect to complete the BSN within 12 months of enrollment in the nursing curriculum

Agreement Follow-Up Procedures:

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying agreement:

Neither party may change this agreement unilaterally. BMCC and Trinity Washington University shall make available to one another timely changes to their policies, respective degree programs and/or curriculum (i.e., admission, curriculum, and degree requirements, course numbers, course content and/or catalog or bulleting descriptions), in writing. Any changes to this agreement must be communicated to the other party, and jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement.

Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Annually, Trinity Washington University will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and the Trinity Washington University website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students. This agreement is designed for students enrolled at BMCC who are interested in transferring to the following academic programs within Trinity Washington University. In addition, Trinity Washington University will block transfer 60 credits in the AA in Liberal Arts. BMCC graduates in the Liberal Arts program may select any major/minor pathway in CAS or SPS to complete their degree, for a total of 120 credits.
