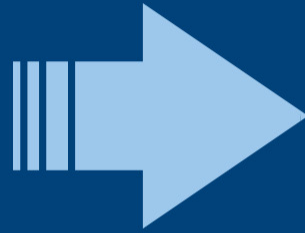

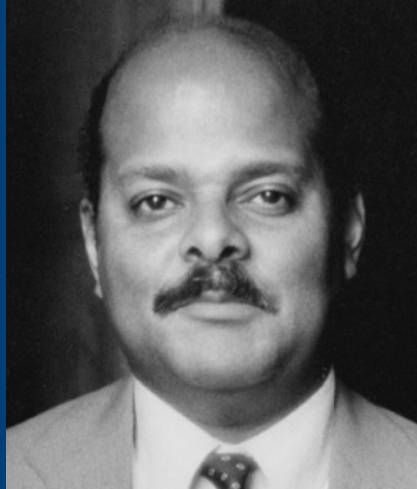
TECHNOLOGY

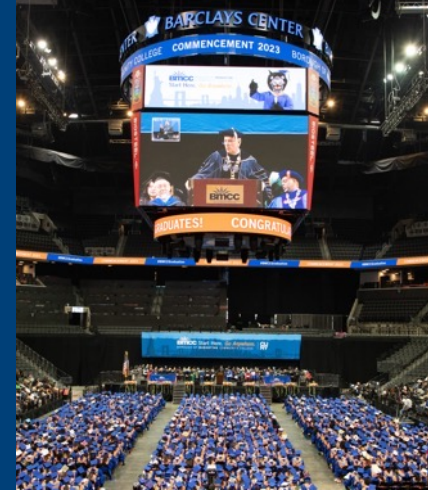
