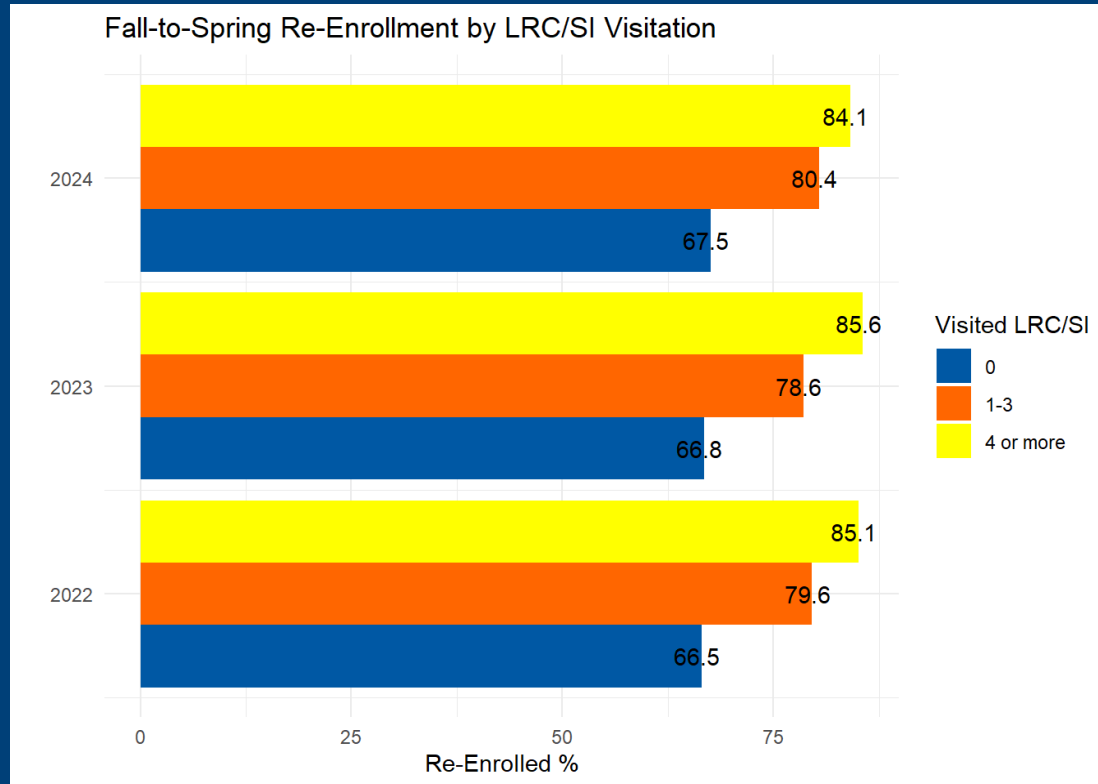

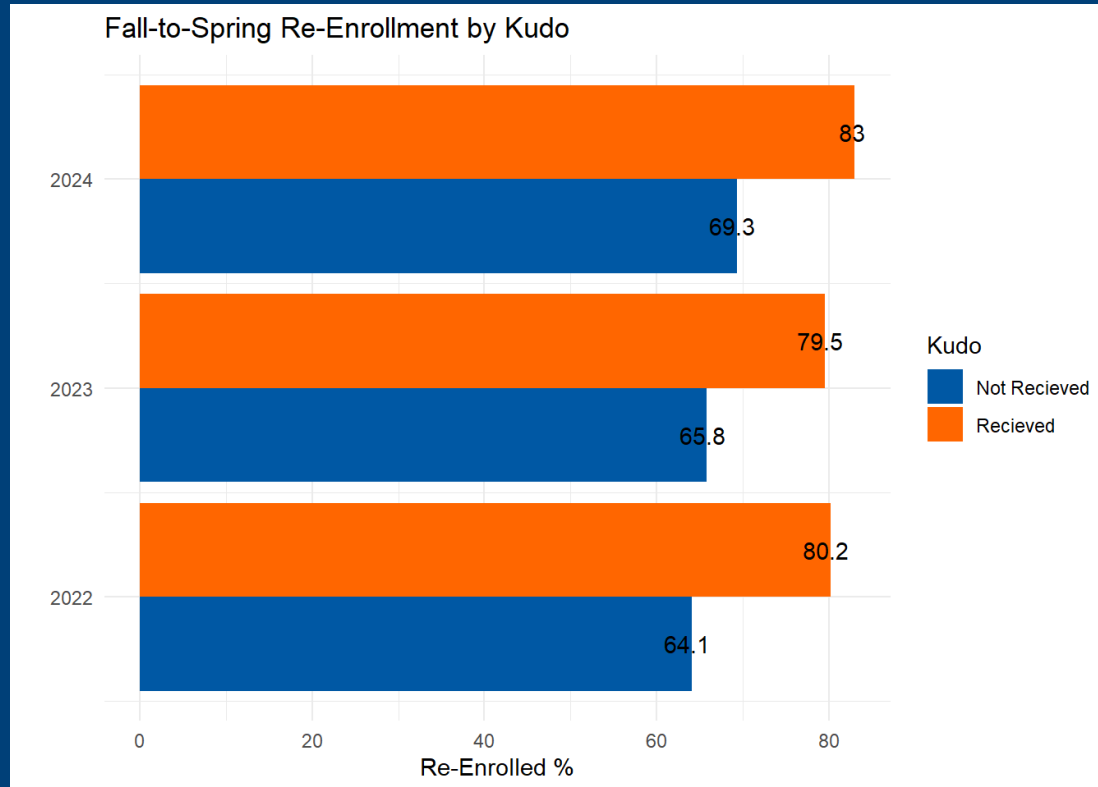

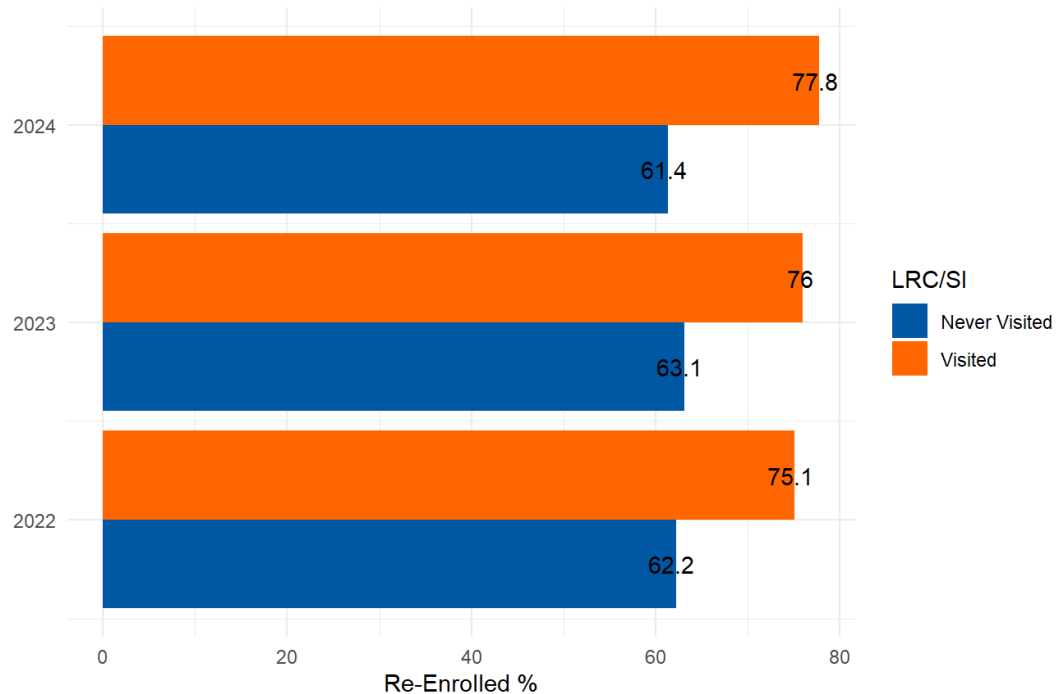

INFORMATION RESOURCE TECHNOLOGY

- Student Technical Fee – is designed to provide funds for improving existing technology related operations and acquiring new technology that substantially benefits students or student success and is used by the students at BMCC.

INSTITUTIONAL ADVANCEMENT

- Current total FY25 individual pledge and cash contributions \$4,682,323 including
 - Trebek Family Foundation contribution - \$30,000

OFFICE OF SPONSORED PROGRAMS

- **\$3,002,500** over five years from the New York State Education Department to support 301 pre-college students in our STEP program. BMCC STEP provides NYC students in the 7th through 12th grades who meet the eligibility requirements with a range of academic enrichment courses, research experience, and special programs in science, mathematics and technology content areas. The program will offer these opportunities to students in the fall, spring, and summer of each year.
- **\$90,806** over three years from the Sloan Foundation, to provide community college students with growth-oriented, multi-institutional pathways to STEM graduate education within the CUNY system. As a subcontractor to CCNY, who secured \$499,408 for the Sloan Bridge Program to STEM Graduate Education, BMCC will serve 5 BMCC students per year, reduce barriers to diversity in STEM graduate education, and participate in an evaluation of high-impact practices to sustain a healthy pipeline to graduate education for students from historically minoritized identities in STEM.
