



**Transfer Articulation Agreement  
between  
Borough of Manhattan Community College  
and  
Morgan State University**

**Effective December 11, 2025 through December 10, 2030**

*This articulation agreement creates a transfer articulation agreement (“Agreement”) between Borough of Manhattan Community College (hereafter referred to as “BMCC” or the “Sending Institution”), an institution of higher education and state agency existing under the laws of the State of New York, and Morgan State University (hereafter referred to as “Morgan” or the “Receiving Institution”), an agency and instrumentality of the State of Maryland located at 1700 E. Cold Spring Lane, Baltimore, Maryland, 21251. BMCC and Morgan are collectively referred to as the “Institutions”.*

**Admissions:**

This Agreement applies only to college students who have successfully graduated from the BMCC with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, or Associate of Applied Science Degree in specific programs, prior to enrollment at Morgan State University. Such persons may apply and be considered for acceptance to Morgan State University in accordance with Morgan’s Transfer Student Policy (“Policy”) based on the following criteria:

**Acceptance** into Morgan State University shall be in accordance with Morgan’s Transfer Student Policy and consideration for acceptance will be in accordance with the terms and conditions set forth herein below for students who complete their associate degree with a minimum BMCC Grade Point Average of **2.00**. Students shall be subject to all of the applicable policies and procedures of the institutions.

**Responsibilities of the Institutions:**

The Institutions agree to facilitate the transfer of Qualifying Students in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations, Morgan State University’s Transfer Student Policy and the following requirements and protocols:

1. A Qualifying Student who has been accepted into Morgan may transfer from the Sending Institution into the Receiving Institution for the completion of the Program.
2. Courses that the Receiving Institution will accept credits for towards completion of the Program are included in Appendix I-Course by Course Articulations.
3. A maximum of seventy (70) credit hours from the Sending Institution or another regionally accredited institution of higher education will be allowed towards fulfillment of the minimum one hundred and twenty (120) credit hours required for baccalaureate completion. The maximum number of credits that will be accepted by Morgan State University toward degree requirements from non-direct classroom instruction (including College Level Examination Program (CLEP), Advanced Placement (AP), International Baccalaureate (IB), and other select nationally recognized standardized examination scores, and other four-year institutions) is ninety (90) credits. If the course is evaluated by Sending institution and applied to the Associates degree or official transcript, the student must submit the official score report to be evaluated by Morgan State University, and credit will be applied as determined by a Morgan State University evaluation. It is possible that not all transferable credit accepted by Morgan State University will be applicable to the degree. Official transcripts from all previously attended institutions will also be required. All transfer students will be required to take a minimum of thirty (30) credits of upper division coursework at Morgan State University, and the last thirty (30) credit hours must be completed at Morgan State University. A minimum of one hundred twenty (120) credits are required for the degree.
4. Morgan cannot guarantee the transferability of courses taken that do not comply with the guidelines outlined in this Agreement or Morgan's [Transfer Student Policy](#). It is important to note that not all transferable credits accepted by Morgan may be applicable to the degree.
5. The Receiving Institution shall designate, and shall provide to the Sending Institution, the contact information for a staff person at the Receiving Institution who is responsible for the oversight of the transfer of Qualifying Students. The Sending Institution shall designate, and shall provide to the Receiving Institution, the contact information for a staff person at the Sending Institution who is responsible for the oversight of the transfer of Qualifying Students.

6. If the Qualifying Student is using education benefits pursuant to Title 38 of the Code of Federal Regulations (GI Bill® Education Benefits), the institutions shall adhere to all applicable U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs’ regulations, including the regulations governing the awarding of prior credit, as regulated under Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations, Sections 21.4253(d)(3) and 21.4254(c)(4).
7. Each institution shall adhere to all applicable transfer requirements set forth in the Annotated Code of Maryland (“Annotated Code”) and the Code of Maryland Regulations (“COMAR”) and Morgan State University’s Transfer Student Policy. In the event of any conflict between this Agreement and Morgan State University’s Transfer Student Policy, the Annotated Code, and/or COMAR, the Policy, Annotated Code, and/or COMAR shall prevail.
8. Each institution shall advise its students regarding transfer opportunities under this Agreement, and shall advise its students of financial aid opportunities and implications associated with the transfer. Appendix II outlines course requirements to be completed at Morgan. Appendix III is a Student Academic Advising Sheet outlining courses to take at the Sending Institution. If students have been admitted to Morgan State University, as part of the standard Morgan onboarding process, the students will be contacted by the Office of Transfer Initiatives with instructions regarding orientation, advising, and registration ([transfer@morgan.edu](mailto:transfer@morgan.edu), <https://www.morgan.edu/transferinitiatives>). Students who have satisfied the requirements of this Agreement will be given every consideration for financial assistance and will be eligible to compete for academic scholarships at Morgan. Financial aid and scholarship information may be found at <https://www.morgan.edu/financialaid>.
9. Morgan State University’s Office of Residence Life and Housing (ORLH), in conjunction with the Division of Enrollment Management and Student Success (EMASS), reserves a limited number of beds for

incoming transfer students. Students from BMCC will have the opportunity to apply to live on campus as a part of this agreement. Students must apply for housing and abide by the ORLH deadlines, as established by their office and published on their [website](#). Applying does not guarantee housing on campus or in university managed off-campus housing.

10. BMCC students transferring into Morgan's baccalaureate programs with a grade point average of 2.5 or higher who meet the transfer admissions priority deadline may be eligible for Morgan's Transfer Incentive Program (TIP) grant, which offers up to \$2,000 per semester for up to five (5) semesters. Students must have earned their Associate's degree by the deadline, have applied to one of the eligible programs listed on our Morgan TIP website (<https://www.morgan.edu/undergradadmissions/tip>), and remain continuously enrolled. Morgan transfer scholarship award amounts are subject to change at any time. Morgan transfer scholarships shall be promoted on both Morgan and BMCC websites. BMCC students are also encouraged to apply for other scholarship opportunities as they become available. For additional information, visit <https://www.morgan.edu/finaid/scholarships>.

#### 11. Joint Advising

- A. BMCC students will be jointly advised by both Morgan State University and BMCC when such students enroll at BMCC to maximize each student's ability to enter Morgan having completed the correct program degree requirements.
- B. BMCC will share contact information for Morgan's [Office of Transfer Initiatives](#) with BMCC students who express interest in attending Morgan and will share contact information about interested students with Morgan so that a Morgan State advisor can provide virtual advising to students interested in transferring to Morgan through this transfer agreement. This program ensures ongoing support from Morgan State University on matters related to course-to-course equivalency, program-specific requirements, reverse transfer options, additional admissions requirements, financial aid, and other issues related to matriculation.
- C. In addition, students will benefit from ongoing, coordinated advising by representatives from both institutions to assist in course selection and ensure familiarity with graduation requirements of their proposed major. The students will also be invited to attend special events hosted by Morgan State University as available.

13. Students intending to transfer must complete the admissions application for Morgan in accordance with the Office of Undergraduate Admission & Recruitment for deadlines for transfer applicants <https://www.morgan.edu/undergradadmissions>. Transfer applicants are encouraged to contact the Office of Transfer Initiatives before submitting their application to request an application fee waiver code <http://www.morgan.edu/transferring>.

14. During the term of this Agreement, Morgan and BMCC shall develop and agree upon a mutually acceptable marketing and student recruitment plan to promote this Agreement and inform students of the opportunities available. Any and all marketing, promotional, or publication materials developed by one party must be reviewed and approved in writing by the other party before the use of any such materials. BMCC agrees to promote this transfer Agreement to eligible students by allowing placement of marketing materials in respective departments on campus and on the BMCC website.

15. To the extent permitted by law, Morgan will provide BMCC with yearly transfer reports. These reports may contain data and information about former BMCC students currently enrolled at Morgan, such as student demographics, transferred credit hours, scholarships awarded, number of bachelor's degrees conferred, and other relevant information, as allowed by law.

**Agreement Follow-Up Procedures:**

***Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying, or terminating agreement:***

Neither party may change this Agreement unilaterally. BMCC and Morgan State University shall make available to one another timely changes to their policies, respective degree programs and/or curriculum (i.e., admission, curriculum, and degree requirements, course numbers, course content and/or catalog or bulletin descriptions), in writing. Any changes to or requests to terminate this Agreement must be communicated to the other party, and jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement. Requests for termination of this agreement, must be sent, in writing, no less than thirty (30) days before the proposed effective date.

***Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:***

Annually, to the extent permissible by law, Morgan State University will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

***Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisors, Websites, etc.:***

This Agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and the Morgan State University website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this Agreement with eligible students.

This Agreement is designed for students enrolled at BMCC who are interested in transferring to any of the academic programs within Morgan State University noted in Appendix A. In addition, Morgan State University will block transfer sixty (60) credits in the AA in Liberal Arts towards its BS in Applied Liberal Studies.

**General Terms:**

Morgan represents and warrants that it is an agency and instrumentality of the State of Maryland, acting in its higher education capacity, and has the legal capacity to enter into this Agreement. Nothing in the terms of this Agreement shall abrogate the responsibilities assigned to Morgan under applicable state and federal laws and regulations, or the policies of Morgan's Board of Regents for the development of curricula, the assessment of student learning, the transfer of students, nor the award of academic degrees.

BMCC represents and warrants that it is an agency and instrumentality of the State of New York and has the legal capacity to enter into this Agreement.

Notwithstanding any other provision of this Agreement, all information relating to student educational records shall be treated in accordance with Maryland law and the Federal Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)(20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99).

Nothing in this Agreement shall be deemed or implied to create a joint venture or partnership of any kind among Morgan and BMCC. Neither Morgan nor BMCC shall have the right to contract on behalf of or bind the other party or make any commitment, representation or warranty for or on behalf of the other party. This Agreement shall have a term commencing on December 11, 2025 and ending on December 10, 2030, unless extended or terminated earlier pursuant to the terms of this Agreement. This Agreement may be amended or extended upon written agreement executed by the Parties.

Either Morgan or BMCC may initiate the termination of this Agreement by providing thirty (30) days written notice to the other party. If this Agreement is terminated, all students identified on or before the effective date of termination will be able to complete their studies in accordance with the terms of this Agreement that are relevant to their specific circumstances.

This Agreement will be governed by the laws of the State of Maryland.

If any section or provision of this Agreement is held illegal, unenforceable or in conflict with any law by a court of competent jurisdiction, such section or provision shall be deemed severed and the validity of the remainder of this Agreement shall not be affected thereby.

Morgan and BMCC each subscribe to a policy of equal opportunity and shall not discriminate against any individual on the basis of age, race, color, creed, gender, gender identity or expression, religion, national origin, marital status, sex or sexual orientation, veteran status or disability.

This Agreement, including the attached Appendices, contains the entire agreement between the institutions and shall not be modified, amended, or supplemented, or any rights herein waived, unless such amendment or modification to this Agreement (i) is in writing; (ii) refers to this Agreement; and (iii) is executed by an authorized representative of each party. This Agreement supersedes any and all previous agreements, whether written or oral between the Institutions.
