<p><u>BUS 104 – Introduction to Business</u></p> <p>This course surveys business and industry in the United States with global growth strategy. Emphasis is placed on building Communication and Quantitative skills, including Excel spreadsheets, and an Ethical Foundation. <p><u>PSY 100 – General Psychology</u></p> <p>The course introduces students to the scientific study of behavior and mental processes. Students will learn about current perspectives, historical roots, and scientific methods in psychology. <p><u>SPE 100 – Fundamentals of Public Speaking</u></p> <p>The aim of this course is to develop effective skills in speech communication. The student examines how to generate topics and organized ideas, master elements of audience psychology, and practices techniques of speech presentation in a public forum. <p><u>SOC 100 – Introduction to Sociology</u></p> <p>This course studies the social world and how it has evolved over time, as well as how individuals are influenced and structured by social interactions in small groups and by larger social forces.
