Purpose: York College and Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) hereby enter into this agreement to facilitate the opportunity for students who wish to transfer from BMCC with an Associate of Arts degree to York College's Community Health Education program.

Changes to Agreement: Neither party may change this agreement unilaterally. Proposed changes in policies and curricula (i.e. admission, curriculum and degree requirements, course numbers, and/or course content) jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Any changes agreed upon must be signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement. Either party may cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation.

This agreement is pursuant to the following details as follows:

A. Admission Requirement for Senior College Program

- Completion of A.S. degree and a minimum GPA of 2.00
- Grade of C or better in any major course to be transferred into the B.S. Program
- Any major course with a grade of C- or less must be repeated to earn a grade of C or better (limited to one opportunity to repeat a course).

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 59

Total credits required for the B.S. degree in Community Health Education: 120

B. Transfer Credits Awarded

Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) graduates who complete the Associate in Science (A.S.) degree in Community Health Education will receive 60 credits toward the Bachelor of Science (B.S.) degree in Community Health Education at York College.

E. Articulation Agreement Follow Up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments or programs, selected by their Chairpersons and/or program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement (i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success):

Each year York College will provide BMCC the following information: a) the number of BMCC graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at York College.

- 3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.):
 - This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website, and the York College website.
 - Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement to eligible students.
