- Have completed pre-requisite courses in Criminal Justice with a grade of C or higher.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester Alfred University will provide Borough of Manhattan Community College with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled and; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Borough of Manhattan Community College website, and the Alfred University website. Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

F. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

Scholarships available to transfer students:

Students who register for a minimum of 12-credits per semester are eligible for all federal and state grant programs for which they meet income eligibility requirements.

TRANSFER OF COURSES FROM BMCC

Alfred University will accept all credits required for the Borough of Manhattan Community College Associate in Science or Associate in Arts degree, in compliance with the General Guarantee of Admission stated above, toward fulfillment of requirements for the bachelor's degree. Any courses that will be applied to the major must have a minimum grade of C.

The minimum number of credits that must be taken through the Alfred University degree completion program in Criminal Justice Studies must result in a minimum total of 124 credits completed through Borough of Manhattan Community College and Alfred University. Alfred University graduation requirements for this program stipulate that a portion of these credits, to be determined by Alfred University, must be completed on the Alfred University campus. Borough of Manhattan Community College graduates that take additional courses through Borough of Manhattan Community College to fulfill the prerequisites for the Alfred University degree completion program may transfer additional credits over and above the number required for the AA or AS degree up to the Alfred University limit of 75 transfer credits. But the minimum number of credits to be completed at Alfred University must result in a total of at least 124 credits.
