B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

- The A.A.S. degree and a minimum GPA of 2.00
- Grade of C or better in a credit-bearing mathematics course worth three or more credits*
- Grade of C or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course*

*(Effective 10/1/08, per University policy)

Students who wish to transfer but do not meet all of the above requirements or are unable to enroll within two years after graduation will receive admission consideration under our standard transfer credit policies.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments or programs, selected by their Chairpersons and program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement (i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success):

Each year Metropolitan College of New York (MCNY) will provide Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) the following information: a) the number of BMCC graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of BMCC students who enrolled; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at MCNY.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.):

- This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Borough of Manhattan Community College's website, and Metropolitan College of New York website.
- Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

F. FINANCIAL BENEFITS AND SCHOLARSHIPS

All BMCC graduates that enroll with MCNY through the articulation program would qualify for a \$1,000 MCNY Transfer Grant each semester over the course of four (4) full-time semesters. In addition to this aid, MCNY will review the students' Expected Family Contribution (EFC) and may offer additional institutional aid. Students may apply for other scholarships, grants and loans for which they qualify for. MCNY students coming from BMCC under this articulation agreement that are continuously enrolled will be eligible for a fixed tuition rate in accordance with MCNY's tuition guarantee policy, as amended from time to time.

G. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

BBA in HSM is an innovative degree completion program from MCNY that enables working people to attend college in a blended education experience (day, evening and weekend; online and on-campus) at enhanced pace as it enables students with an AAS Degree to complete their education in one year and four months as full-time students.
