F. Articulation Agreement Follow-up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons and/or their program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester Queens College (the receiving college) will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; d) and the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and Queens College's website. Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

G. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)

Queens College offers several scholarships each year which are awarded to English Majors. Information on the criteria for awards and scholarships and application deadlines is available in the English Department.
