1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments or programs, selected by their Chairpersons and program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement (i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success):

Each year Medgar Evers College (MEC) will provide Borough of Manhattan Community College (BMCC) the following information: a) the number of BMCC graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at Medgar Evers College.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement (e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.):

- This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Borough of Manhattan Community College's website and Medgar Evers College's website.
- Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
