

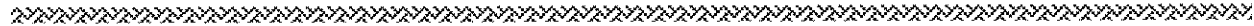

Scholarships for Transfer Students

Eligibility is strictly based on the academic grade point average (GPA) from all colleges previously attended. All scholarships are renewable for a maximum of eight semesters (four years) and may only be used in fall and spring terms provided the student is enrolled as a full-time student and maintains the minimum GPA as illustrated in the chart below.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs or if the admissions requirements involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments or programs, selected by their Chairpersons and program directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each year St. Francis College will provide Borough of Manhattan Community College the following information: a) the number of BMCC graduates who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of BMCC students who enrolled; d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students at St. Francis College.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

- This articulation agreement will be publicized on the Borough of Manhattan Community College's website, and St. Francis College website.
- Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
