² SJC accepts all six BMCC Associate's Degree fieldwork credits as part of their total transfer credits, accepting them as the equivalent of HS 474, but BMCC transfers will have to take HS 475 at SJC. There are 350 hours of fieldwork required for the SJC BS in Human Services, and BMCC students will transfer 168 hours (from HUM 301 and 401) to SJC. If the students work in a Human Services agency, SJC can further deduct 50 hours, leaving the BMCC transfer students with 132 additional hours to be completed in HS 475 at SJC.

³ BMCC's HUM 401 will count as 3 elective credits at SJC.

E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES

1. *Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:*
When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their chairpersons/program director.
2. *Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*
Each semester St. Joseph's College will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
3. *Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, websites, etc.:*
This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website *and* the St. Joseph's College website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement to eligible students and notify them about SJC Admissions and Human Services visits to the BMCC campus.

F. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION (E.G., FINANCIAL AID, TRANSFER SCHOLARSHIPS)

Students who demonstrate financial need, special interest and/or academic promise may be considered for additional grants. Award amounts vary according to financial need and available funds. SJC offers transfer scholarships for students who have completed 24 or more credits:

2.8 to 2.99 GPA: \$5000

3.0 to 3.39: \$8000

3.4 to 3.69: \$9000

3.7 to 4.0: \$11,000

Also, if a student belongs to the Phi Theta Kappa National Honor Society, SJC awards the \$1000 PTK Award. SJC also will award this amount to a student who belongs to BMCC's honor society.
