**B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR RN to BSN Online Option**

**A diploma or Associate Degree in Nursing with a minimum**

- CGPA of 2.0
- A grade of “C” or higher is required for all transfer credits
- Current, active RN license in the U.S. or in a jurisdiction that is an associate member of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN). All students must maintain licensure throughout the program of study.

**Program Details – RN to BSN Online Option**

Registered nurses with current, active RN licensure in the U.S. or a jurisdiction that is an associate member of the National Council of State Boards of Nursing (NCSBN) will be awarded 82 proficiency credit hours through the Chamberlain College of Nursing Articulation Plan (CCAP). This includes 37 liberal arts and sciences credits and 45 nursing credits.

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 47

Total credits required for the RN-BSN degree at Chamberlain College of Nursing: 129

**E. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW-UP PROCEDURES**

**1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:**

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons.

**2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:**

Each semester Chamberlain College of Nursing will provide the Borough of Manhattan Community College the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) and the number of BMCC students who enrolled.

### **3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:**

This articulation agreement will be publicizing on the Borough of Manhattan Community College's website, and Chamberlain College of Nursing's website.

Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.

### **F. Additional Information (e.g., financial aid, transfer scholarships)**

Chamberlain College of Nursing also offers several scholarships that students may apply for. If a student is eligible for both the 10% reduction and a scholarship, the benefit that is in the student's best financial interest will be applied. If the student is eligible for a scholarship, and receives that as it is in their best financial interest, but then loses eligibility for that scholarship, the student will still be eligible to receive the tuition benefit in place at that time.
