B. Admissions Requirements for Senior College Program

- The A.S degree in Public Health from BMCC with a minimum of 60 credits
- In order to be formally admitted to the Public Health Program, students must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 for all coursework completed and at least 12 credits with a minimum GPA of 3.0 in the following Public Health courses: HED 280 (PH 201) and HED 295 (PH 210) or HED 285 (PH 215) or HED 290 (PH 225) or HED 296 (PH 320).
- Grade of C or better in freshman composition, its equivalent, or a higher-level English course
- Successful completion of a minimum 3 credit college-level math course

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: <u>60</u>

Total credits required to complete the baccalaureate degree: <u>120</u>

F. Articulation Agreement Follow-up Procedures

1. Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating agreement:

When either of the degree programs involved in this agreement undergoes a change, the agreement will be reviewed and revised accordingly by faculty from each institution's respective departments, selected by their Chairpersons/ Program Directors.

2. Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:

Each semester York College will provide BMCC the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.

3. Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:

This articulation agreement will be publicizing on the BMCC website, and the York College website. Transfer advisors at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
