<sup>2</sup> Students must take either SOC 200 or SOC 250, which transfer as SOC 302 and SOC 202, respectively, to satisfy John Jay's major requirements Part Four: Sociology Elective.

<sup>3</sup> Students must take SOC 240 in order to get transfer credit for SOC 201, which satisfies John Jay's major requirements Part Three: Specialization. Students can choose to specialize in either Global Change or Inequality & Social Justice.

- Procedures for evaluating agreement, i.e., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success:*  
Each semester John Jay will provide BMCC with the following information: a) the number of BMCC students who applied to the program; b) the number of BMCC students who were accepted into the program; c) the number of BMCC students who enrolled; and d) the aggregate GPA of these enrolled students.
- Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites, etc.:*  
This articulation agreement will be publicized on the BMCC website and on John Jay's website. Transfer advisers at BMCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
